

Getting Beyond the Manufactures Beginners Palette And the Basic Primary Palette

Here are a few startup pallets for you to get a head start on your painting. Remember, it is better to mix greens and your earth tones - (Umbers and Siennas): example, student class mixing chart on page 51.

Palette for Sea Seascapes

The following colors are the palette used for Sea Scapes: Burnt Umber, Raw Umber, Burnt Sienna, Raw Sienna, Mauve, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Red Light, Cadmium Orange Yellow Ochre, Cadmium Yellow Pale, Hookers Green Viridian, Cobalt Blue, Cerulean Blue, Ultramarine Blue and Indigo, White. This palette is excellent for temperate zones and North Seas. You can add Thalo Blue and trade out Viridian for Sap Green. Add Lemon Yellow and you will have a tropical Seascape palette.

Simplified Seascape Palettes - This will give you lots of sand colors.

Cadmium Orange, Burnt Umber, Raw Umber, Alizarin Crimson, Ultramarine Blue, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Cadmium Red Light, Yellow Ocher and White,

Cadmium Orange, Cadmium Red Light, Cadmium Yellow Light, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Alizarin Crimson, Viridian, Yellow Ochre and White.

Prussian Blue, Van Dyke Brown, Alizarin Crimson, Viridian and White.

Dark Waters;

Raw Umber, Burnt Umber, Cadmium Yellow Deep, Cadmium Yellow Pale, Cadmium Orange, Cadmium Yellow Medium, Prussian Blue, Ultramarine Blue, Chrome Oxide Green and White.

Cadmium Orange, Cadmium Yellow Light, Burnt Umber, Raw Umber, Ultramarine Blue, Prussian Blue and White.
